In addition, this economic type utilizes government control and regulation in varying degrees to achieve goals of the elite ruling class.</p>
<p>Economies that have parts of two or more types of other economies mixed in.</p>	<p>A state of no government.</p>	<p>A limited monarchy, constrained by a constitution and ruled with the help of an elected legislature.</p>
<p>Majority rules with no protection for the minority.</p>	<p>Absolute rule by a small group, either with an individual or political party in charge. Power is held by force.</p>	<p>A limited government, deriving its power from the people, with a constitution of law restraining the government from taking the liberty of the people.</p>
<p>Ostensibly all property and goods are owned in common and shared equally, but in reality the wealth is held by a few elite and taken from the rest of the people by force. All means of production are owned by the government.</p>
